President's Report – Janie Emerson

Lifeguards – Lt. Lonnie Stephens

Summer staffing schedule begins June 16 through Labor Day. Good staffing set for La Jolla to keep beaches safe for summer season.

SDPD Report - Lt. Brian Brecht

Memorial Day weekend had minimal incidents. Beach areas from Mission Beach to La Jolla now staffed for summer including boats, on foot, 4x4 vehicles and teams at designated locations to avoid traffic delays. Enforcing fire and food vending ordinances with discretionary; warnings and education. Monitoring unsafe camping ordinance.

Comments included transient attack and arrest. Be aware of surroundings, walk in pairs.

Mayor's Office – Emily Piatanesi

City Fiscal Year 2024 budget has been approved. The unsafe camping ordinance was passed by City Council. It prohibits tent encampments deemed a threat to public health and public safety, including parks, canyons, beaches and open spaces citywide. Comprehensive strategy to increase shelter capacity and resources is underway, including enforcement.

3rd County District, Terra Lawson-Remer - Spencer Katz

County budget vote is upcoming which includes \$52 million investment protecting beaches and oceans from pollution; \$7 million for fentanyl programs; \$10 million for mobile crisis response programs; \$37 million for behavioral health concerns. The County received \$14 million from an opioid manufacture settlement and is using funds for related programs.

ACTION ITEMS

Shores Street Lights – Rick Kent

Rick thanked Jie Xiao and his team at the City for assistance with this project to replace the street lights. Key element is finding a product to ensure “dark sky” compliance which means being shaded to provide light distribution cutoff at no higher than 90 degrees.

Comments included losing illumination from a safety perspective; surveillance cameras; lights shining into homes or focused downward.

MOTION: Select the GE Luminaire product on concrete poles with the following characteristics:

- Remove finial, crown and ribs and use simplest pod
- Clear acrylic globe with frosted LED housing
- Powder coat with RAL 7048 gray metallic color for metal parts
- Concrete pole with Amerishield anti-graffiti coating
