Classes & Differences




THREE MAJOR CLASSES:

- 1. Pedal assisted power. Power maxes out at 20mph.
- 2. Power controlled by a throttle. Power won't go faster than 20 mph.
- 3. Pedal power. Max assisted speed of 28mph. Age limit of 16 and up. Helmets required for all users all the time. No matter the age.

Expected Speed

Speed limits vs relative speed. Always be aware.

"Always on" is a waste

Use it to get up to relative speed. You can overheat the engine pretty easily.



Fastest way to drain a battery

Keep it gradual. No one drives a car with the gas pedal pushed all the way to the floor.

Register & Lock

The more expensive the bike, the more expensive the lock





Where To Ride

YOU'RE DRIVING A BIKE

Riding in bike lanes is required as long as the bike lane is clear and safe to ride in.

Some trails do not allow e-bikes so check trail markings before you ride.

Type 3 e-bikes can't use bike paths. They're too fast.

Predictability. Ride where others expect to see you.


Sidewalks are for walking. Crosswalks are for walking.

The rules of the road apply to all users of the road.

Signals & Signs

USING WHEELS ON THE ROAD?

Traffic lights, traffic signs, and signals apply to all road users. Even on a bike you must fully stop at all stop signs.

The "sharrow" means the lane is too narrow for a bicycle and a motor vehicle to share safely side by side. Bicyclists should discourage unsafe passing by riding towards the middle of the narrow lane. Cars must give three feet to pass.



Passengers & Gear

SAFE WHEN IT'S SAFE



Passengers in cars sit in seats.

Not all e-bikes are equipped to take passengers.

Passengers are required to wear a helmet

Always ride lawfully and responsibly and especially when you're riding with a passenger.




Getting closer to a car replacement

<u>S84.18 Operation of Motorized Transportation</u> <u>Devices on Boardwalks Prohibited</u>

(a) Motorized transportation device means any motorized device used for personal transportation, whether rented or owned. Motorized transportation device includes: shared mobility devices, electric bicycles, motorized scooters as defined in section 83.0302; electric personal assistive mobility devices as defined in section 83.0402; and any other motorized device that state law permits local agencies to regulate, except motorized device used to assist a physically disabled person.

(b) It is unlawful for any person to operate any motorized transportation device in the following locations: on the public walkway on Ocean Front Walk in Mission Beach,

- (1) beginning at the South Mission Beach Jetty northward to the terminus of the public walkway at Ocean Boulevard at Law Street in Pacific Beach;
- (2) on the public walkway on the west side of Mission Bay Park from San Diego Place (adjacent to the South Mission Beach Jetty) to Corona Oriente Road (terminus of Crown Point Park), known as Bayside Walk;
- (3) on the public walkway on the east side of Mission Bay Park from De Anza Road southward to the South Shores Boat Launch and Park; and
- (4) on the boardwalk from Avenida De La Playa (adjacent to La Jolla Shores) north to the terminus of Kellogg Park at its northeast comer.
- (c) The prohibition in section 84.18 shall not apply to any physically disabled person using a motorized transportation device in these locations.
- (d) The prohibition in section 84.18 shall not apply to any employee, agent, or officer of the City while engaging in law enforcement activities...
