Reports:

President's Report – February agenda is already filling up. The February meeting will be held on February 7th instead of February 14th.

Andrew Perry continues to monitor the status of the undergrounding project.
Mike McCormack commented on the plywood placed on the windows on the "Mushroom House."
Bill Kellogg announced that plans are underway to produce another Fourth of July drone show with double the number of drones. Donations are welcome.

Representatives' Reports:

Lifeguards – Lt. Lonnie Stephens

Recent large surf with 100 surf related rescues. In practical training mode for cliff rescues, marine firefighting, emergency technical skills. Candidates going through advancement academy.

Comments include sand and debris due to coastal flooding; jet ski incident under investigation; timing for Surf RFP; appreciation to lifeguards during recent storm; sea lions washed up on beach.

SDPD Report – Lt. Brian Brecht

Crimes against persons has decreased 36%; property crimes increased 8%. E-bike enforcement with citations being issued.

Comments included enforcement of dog and sign violations; staffing; people living in vehicles; dogs are not allowed in parks, lots or walkways.

Beach enforcement coverage is seven days during the summer; it is Monday through Friday until 8pm during the winter.

Committee representatives met with City representatives to consider different approaches for to locate 24 additional parking for Shores Outside Dining. Concepts include: 1) a state law extending the deadline to find additional parking until July 2026; 2) convert parallel parking to diagonal parking along at east side of Kellogg Park Parking Lot; 3) install parallel parking spaces in grass strip from Kellogg Park Parking lot south to Vallecitos. Further updates will be provided after the City has responded.

La Jolla Shores Outdoor Dining has been approved as a special event to continue through December 2024.

Spindrift/Marine Room Beach Access – Kathleen Neil

Will report back as information becomes available concerning soils report and interactions with the City and interested parties for any other options to improve the conditions of the walkway at the Spindrift/Marine Room beach access point.

Zoning and Mental Health Houses – Dan Courtney and Karen Marshall

It has been learned that a residence on Torrey Pines Road is being used for services for people with mental health issues. Nearby residents stated that they received

no notification from the Mental Health Center of San Diego leasing the residence. Concerns include knowing what the zoning requirements are, if residents are registered sex offenders or convicted felons, how many are living onsite, what safety precautions are in place. A list of questions will be sent to the facility and the county; a follow up report provided at a future meeting.

Elections Committee Report – Janie Emerson

There are 5 openings on the LJSB board for the annual elections on March 13. Pam Boynton, Sharon Luscomb and Janie Emerson are termed out; Rick Kent and Terry Kraszewski are eligible to run again.

To vote in the annual election or run for the board, you must be a Registered Member by midnight on January 12th. Registered Members who want to be involved with our community and are willing to give time to be on committees may declare their candidacy by the end of the February 7th meeting.

The City Council is considering amending the vending ordinance to install concrete pads in coastal parks and beaches - 2 in Ocean Beach, 3 in Mission Beach, 2 in Pacific Beach and 6 in La Jolla (including 2 at Kellogg Park).
