Reports:

President's Report – UCSD Commencement on June 15 including fireworks display. John reminded the Board to make a contribution to the organization's treasury to offset the cost of the Directors and Officers Insurance.

Treasurer's Report – Balance is \$4,787.05 as of May 31, 2024.

Secretary's Report – Directors who abstain from a vote must disclose the reason (such as a conflict of interest). Directors who miss three monthly meetings in one year may be removed from the Board. The annual year is from April through March.

Andrew Perry reported that the undergrounding project has equipment delays and no work during the summer moratorium.

Janie Emerson reported that the Association for the City of La Jolla seeks registered voters who live in La Jolla to sign a petition for the County to explore feasibility of La Jolla becoming its own city.

Mike McCormack commented on high vehicle traffic speeds throughout the area.

Dick Dahlberg reported that he spoke with Emily Lynch on Council President Pro Tem LaCava's office concerning attention and support for a long-term landscape solution along La Jolla Parkway.

Representatives' Reports:

Lifeguards – Lt. Lonnie Stephens

Reported that the lifeguards full summer operations with 80 lifeguards in the district of La Jolla with adequate staffing for Fourth of July holiday weekend. Reminders to swim near lifeguard towers, stay out of rip currents, be aware of stingrays. In June, there were approximately 285,000 people at La Jolla Shores with 3,400 preventative actions.

SDPD Report – Officer Jessica Thrift

John Pierce reported on behalf of Officer Thrift that there were no critical incidents over the Memorial Day holiday. Officers have been in the coastal communities addressing e-bike and traffic concerns, and at Marine Street beach to deter under-age drinking. Anticipate almost 150 officers in the neighboring communities for Fourth of July holiday weekend.

Working closely with Parks and Rec department to address vendors throughout the coastal communities.
Comments included enforcing fires in fire rings and enhanced patrol at Camino del Oro and El Paseo Grande due to vehicles running the stop sign.

Scott Wahl appointed as Chief of Police; announced that Fire Rescue Chief Robert Logan is expected to be appointed soon. City fiscal year 2025 budget has been approved.
